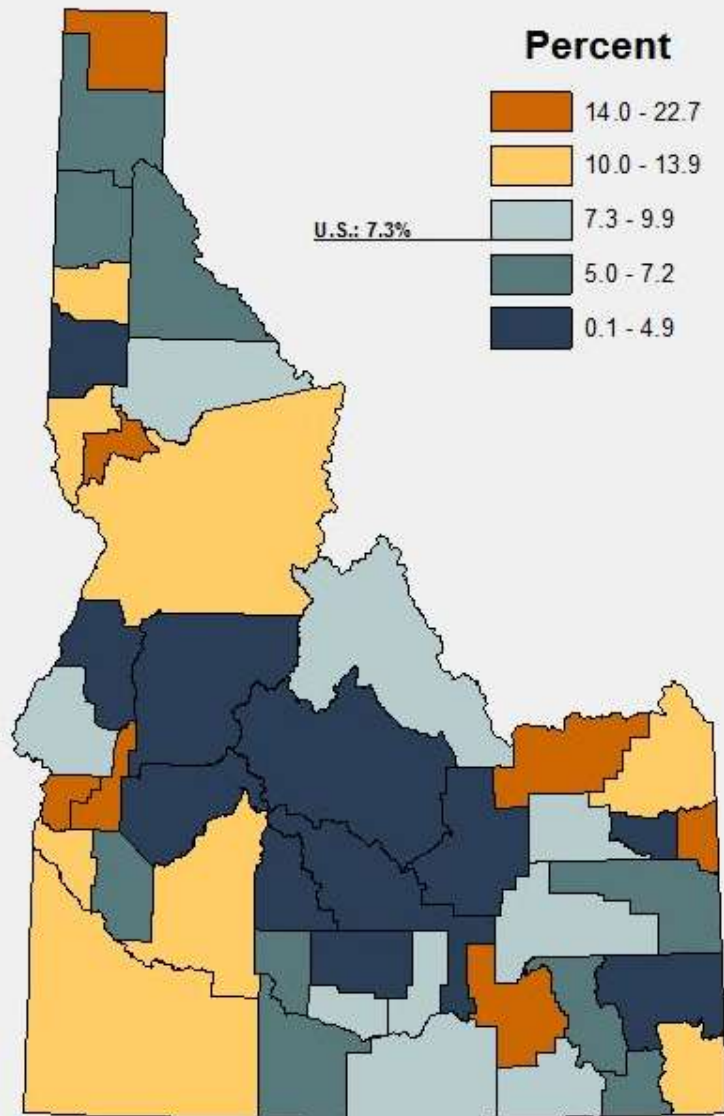


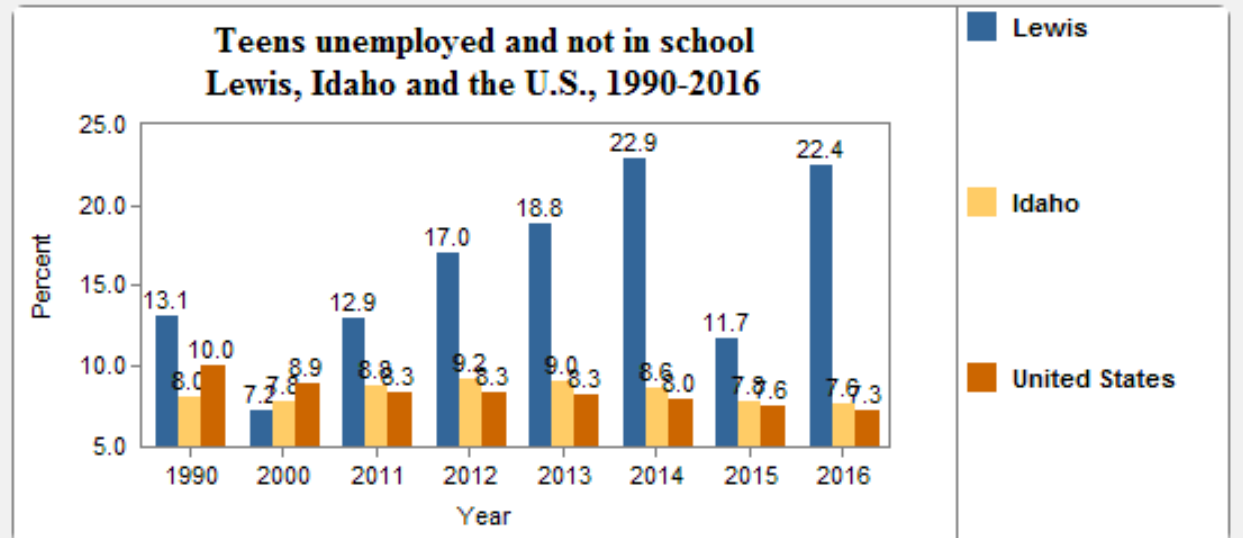
Teens unemployed and not in school, 2012-2016
For specific county values, move your cursor across the map.



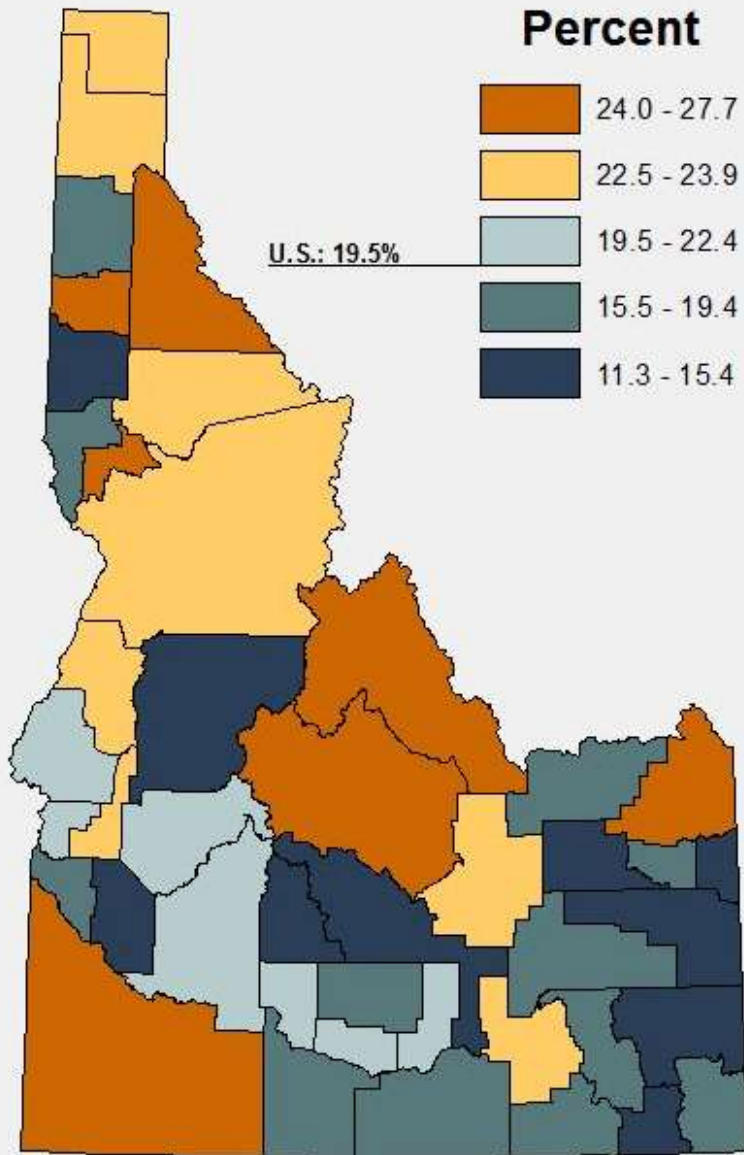

Teenagers who are neither working, looking for work, nor in school are usually “hanging out” with nothing to do and no place to go. In Lewis . . .

- Teens who were not working, looking for work, or in school made up 22.4 percent of all youth age 16-19 in 2012-2016, compared to 7.6 percent in Idaho.
- The proportion of teens in this group was up from 13.1 percent in 1990 to 22.4 percent in 2012-2016.



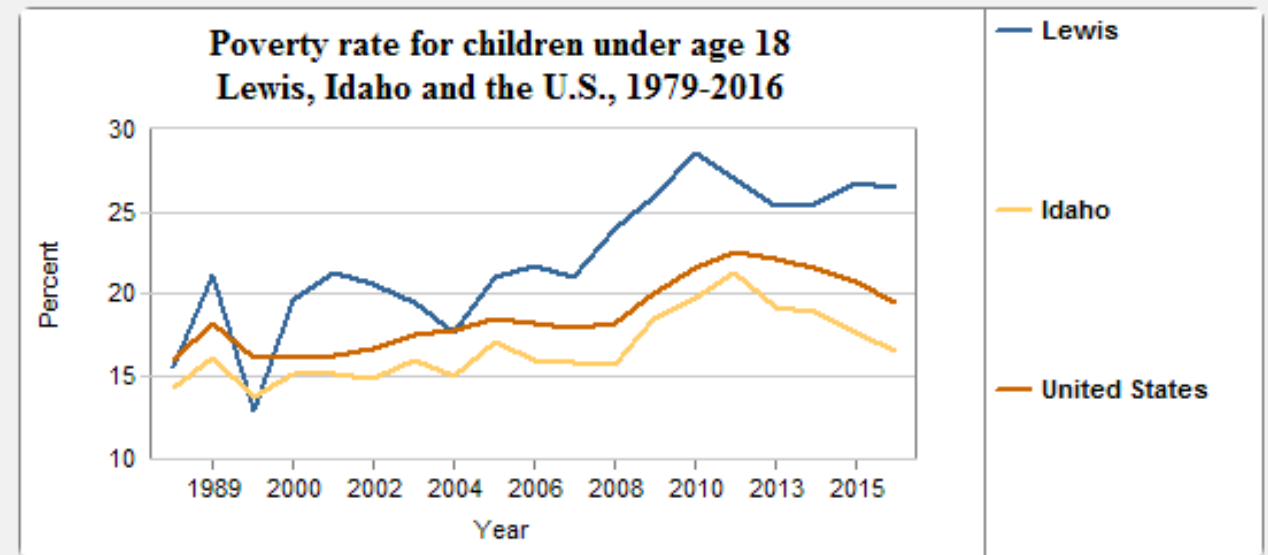
Child poverty rate (under age 18), 2016
For specific county values, move your cursor across the map.



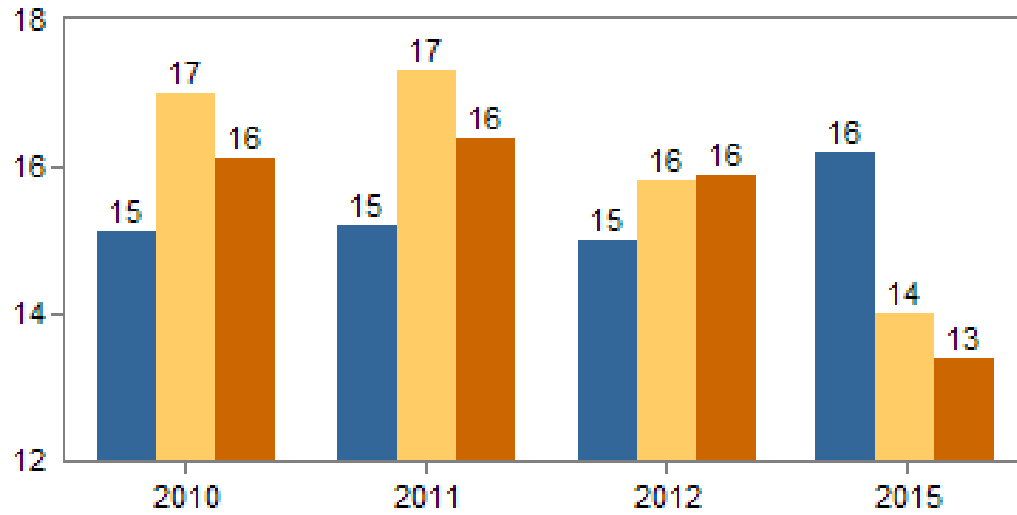

Among Lewis's residents, the poverty rate for people under 18 . . .

- was 26.5 percent in 2016, 12.9 percent in 1999, and 21.2 percent in 1989;
- was 26.5 percent compared to 16.6 percent in Idaho in 2016;
- ranked 3rd - from highest to lowest - out of the 44 counties in 2016.

In Lewis in 2015:

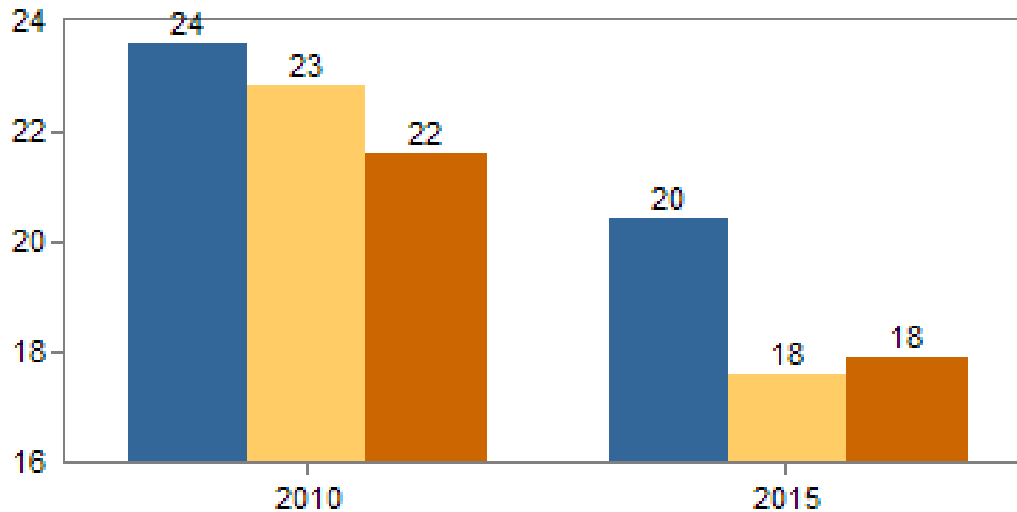
- the food insecure population made up 16 percent of the population and numbered 620.
- food insecure children made up 20 percent of all children under age 18 and numbered 170.

In Lewis in 2010:

- the food insecure population made up 15 percent of the population and numbered 570.
- food insecure children made up 24 percent of all children under age 18 and numbered 190.

Between 2010 and 2015, the food insecure population in Lewis increased by 9 percent and the number of food insecure children decreased by 11 percent.

Educational attainment refers to the highest level of school completed. In Lewis between 2012-2016 . . .

- 10.6 percent of the population 25 years and older had no high school diploma, compared to 10.0 percent in Idaho
- 16.0 percent of the population 25 years and older had a bachelor's degree or higher, compared to 26.2 percent in Idaho

NOTE: There is no problem with comparing these data to census data from 2000.
